

## Liberty Church PCA Macro-Curriculum Plan

**Biblical:** The Sunday school curriculum will focus on studying the bible and learning how to study the bible through inductive, in-depth, progressive bible study.

**Reformed:** The Westminster standards will be covered in an integrated approach. Teaching in Systematic and Practical Theology will be informed by the standards and incorporate the standards.

**Pentateuch:** The first five books of the bible. We will focus on Genesis.

**Historical Books:** Joshua, Judges, Ruth, 1 and 2 Samuel, 1 and 2 Kings, 1 and 2 Chronicles, Ezra, Nehemiah, Esther. We will focus on 1 and 2 Samuel.

**Wisdom Literature:** Job, Psalms, Ecclesiastes, Song of Solomon, focusing on Proverbs.

**Prophets:** Isaiah, Jeremiah, Lamentations, Ezekiel, Daniel, Hosea, Joel, Amos, Obadiah, Jonah, Micah, Nahum, Habbakuk, Zephaniah, Haggai, Zechariah, Malachi. We will focus on Jeremiah.

**Gospels:** Matthew, Mark, Luke, and John. We will focus on Matthew in Sunday school and talks will be drawn from the others for Wyld Life and F.I.S.H.

**Acts:** The Acts of the Apostles is the story of the initial overcoming spread of the gospel.

**Letters:** Romans, 1 and 2 Corinthians, Galatians, Ephesians, Philippians, Colossians, 1 and 2 Thessalonians, 1 and 2 Timothy, Titus, Philemon, Hebrews, James, 1 and 2 Peter, 1, 2, and 3 John, Jude, Revelation. We will focus on James in Sunday school and investigative bible studies will use Romans, Galatians, and Phillipians.

**Revelation:** Albeit a letter, it is very much the prophecy of the New Testament.

**Covenant Theology:** How the whole of the biblical narrative fits together.

**Prolegomena/Hermeneutics:** Prolegomena is the study of how we know things in general, how we can know the bible is true and especially how we know things about God. Hermeneutics is the study of biblical interpretation. We will call it, "First Things."

**Theology:** This is the study of God, his persons, attributes, and character.

**Anthropology:** This is the study of man, particularly in relation to God, his limitations, his abilities, his sin, his suffering, and his future glory.

**Christology:** This is the study of Jesus Christ, the god-man, his acts, and his character.

**Soteriology:** This is the study of how people are saved, justified, adopted, regenerated, sanctified, glorified and the means of grace Christ uses to bring this about.

**Pneumatology:** This is the study of the Holy Spirit, spiritual gifts, and spiritual fruit.  
**Ecclesiology:** This is the study of the church, her government, her sacraments and story.  
**Eschatology:** This is the study of the end times and the interpretation of current times.  
**Hamartology:** This is the study of sin and its effects in our lives.  
**Theodicy:** This is the justification of God in spite of the existence of pain and suffering.

**Ethics:** This is the study of how we apply the law of God in our lives.  
**Missional Apologetics:** This is the study of how we live out the mission of God to the world by seeking to share, articulate, and defend our faith with our whole life.  
**Family:** Here we will study roles in the family, how family affects us, how God uses families, how sin affects families, and how we are incorporated into God’s family.  
**Friends:** Here we will study how friendship is a gift from the Lord and how we can glorify God in our friendships.  
**Media:** Here we will interpret current: Film, Music, Games, Poetry, Non-fiction, and Fiction in order to understand new insights into the gospel and how to communicate it.  
**Purity:** Here we will examine the purity God gives us and the purity he requires of us. We will look at how that affects our views of dating, marriage, divorce, homosexuality, adultery, and other sexual sin.  
**Church History:** Here we will study the progress of the gospel in individual lives and in the world so that we may be encouraged and join in the progress of the gospel even now.  
**Service:** Here we will study what the new commandment means: to love one another even as Christ loved us.  
**Other Religions:** Here we will look at various other religions to better understand Christianity, appreciate the gospel, and to know better how to communicate the gospel.
