PASTOR'S VIEWS

Hebrews 10:19–25 (NKJV)

19 Therefore, brethren, having boldness to enter the Holiest by the blood of Jesus, 20 by a new and living way which He consecrated for us, through the veil, that is, His flesh, 21 and having a High Priest over the house of God, 22 let us draw near with a true heart in full assurance of faith, having our hearts sprinkled from an evil conscience and our bodies washed with pure water. 23 Let us hold fast the confession of our hope without wavering, for He who promised is faithful. 24 And let us consider one another in order to stir up love and good works, 25 not forsaking the assembling of ourselves together, as is the manner of some, but exhorting one another, and so much the more as you see the Day approaching.

2021 was quite a year... I'm sure you all agree. Liberty church faced some very significant challenges but with admirable resolve, and for the most part, a focused determination to "stick it out", confident that God would bless us. No church can remain unaffected when their senior pastor is taken from them, suddenly and without satisfying explanation. Then, our Associate Pastor of over 20 years relocated to Pennsylvania to take up a new and exciting ministry that he had long dreamed of having. Barry left with our blessing, and we commend him to His Lord's work, yet, his departure did not go unnoticed.

I came to Liberty as the Interim Pastor or "Stated Supply" in May. During that time, I have been deeply impressed by the embracing warmth of the community as a whole and by many individuals specifically. I have thoroughly enjoyed my ministry here and God has given me several insights into the fruit that He is bringing among us.

During my first few months here, we were still working under the "mask mandates" occasioned by the spread of the "Delta" variant of Covid. I can remember the delight registered in the congregation when we were at last able to shed those cumbersome requirements and especially when we were able to take the Lord's Supper as it should be observed. It's only human to expect some discouragement now as we have to return to some of those precautions. The "Omicron" variant has really hit us hard. My wife and I were virtually incapacitated for two weeks or so and are not yet fully recovered. Many others remain in seclusion because of it. How we look forward to the dread pall of the disease being lifted from our lives.

Another challenge we have met and seen bear some fruit is an increased level of awareness and involvement with our LCS ministry. I meet regularly with the Head Mistress, and we have resumed quarterly reports from her and members of the LCS board at our Session meetings. I believe God is moving among us

in this regard and I pray for continued encouragement.

We have had several congregational meetings and, in the process, have selected and set to work, a pastoral search committee. This year we did something that I do not believe Liberty has done in the past. The Session drafted a Senior Pastor Job Description and presented it to the congregation for approval, which it did. Further, the congregation adopted a guidance paper for the search committee listing several critical attributes and ministry strategies to allow the search committee to be more efficient in its work.

A particular aspect of my call to this position was that I was to supervise the staff. That has been a true joy for me. Liberty is blessed with a motivated staff that has worked hard to make things go smoothly at the church. Some examples of the coordination they achieved was for the Christmas Concert and Christmas Eve service, Thanksgiving Eve Service, the Labor Day picnic, two infant baptism services, among others that I can't bring to mind.

This year we have formalized the service to our brothers and sisters at Carrol Lutheran Village. The Session has authorized it as a ministry of our church, and we are meeting once a month for an abbreviated but complete worship service including serving the Lord's Supper. RE Michael Anderson has come along side with me for this effort and assists in the service. This service has helped our brothers and sisters sense their continued connection to our church in a deeper fashion and they appear to greatly appreciate it.

So, let's consider this last year from the Lord's perspective. It has been difficult, but He certainly has brought good out of it. We should not be unduly discouraged by the return of Covid precautions. God has many good things in store for us this coming year, not the least, Lord willing, is the calling of a new pastor. So, as the writer to the Hebrews states above: "Let us hold fast... and consider one another in order to stir up love and good works." Let us strive by all of God's appointments to continue "assembling ourselves together", demonstrating that, though "Satan should buffet", he shall not overcome.

May God bless us all... everyone.

Financial Management Committee

We praise God for the faithful giving of the Lord's people. As members of the FMC, we see those monies given by the congregation as a form of worship to our Lord and always try to keep this truth in the forefront of our work for Him. The final reports for 2021 are still to be completed, with reconciliation of all accounts being done in early January of next year. The final reports will be distributed to the congregational sometime before the planned congregational meeting in late January 2022.

For the most part 2021 has been a year of a decrease in our overall budgeted expenses coupled with a slight decrease in tithes and offerings as of the date of this report. The church received forgiven funds through the PPP1 program through the application initiated by Liberty Christian School of approximately \$41,000.00. Additionally, late this year the church received an equity payment as part of the sale of Pastor Barry's home, approximately \$30,000.00, as part of an agreement between Pastor Barry and the church initiated 11 years ago. With these monies and the decrease in expenses it was a time to invest in the Liberty Church campus and buildings, which included the parking lot, new roofs for the church and block building, cosmetic work and an unplanned replacement of a boiler.

There is much that takes place behind the scenes which makes up the ministry of caring for funds given in the Lord's name and given as a form of worship to Him. From the ushers who collect the offerings, to the counting teams, to the treasurer and committee members, to those who track each members giving and issue statements, all these parts play a critical role in the faithful administration of the Lord's funds. As chairperson, I am humbled by what I see and am so thankful that I am supported by such a wonderful group of brothers and sisters in Christ.

Children's Sunday School

After cancelling classes for almost a year due to the COVID-19 Pandemic, Liberty was able to reopen five Children's Sunday School classes in February of 2021. At this time we began using Answers Bible Curriculum from Answers in Genesis. This curriculum adapts concepts to each developmental age group allowing us to synchronize the lesson topics being taught across all classes. This allows families with children in multiple age groups to easily follow up at home on the lesson topics that are taught each week in Sunday School. This year we have had about 25-30 children attending Sunday School across all of the age groups.

This year, we held the first Cross-Generational Sunday School lesson including children and adults. It was a great time to be together to learn and discuss our faith together! We hope to hold several more Cross-Generational Sunday School lessons in 2022.

Vacation Bible School

We look forward to hosting a Vacation Bible School in summer of 2022. Our theme this year will be "Zoomerang: Returning to the Value of Life".

Family Ministry

As we go into 2022, we look to have fellowship opportunities available for families like bonfires, picnics and day trips. We look forward to this blessing of being together!

"Living Stones" Youth Ministry

Living Stones is our youth ministry for middle & high school students. Obviously, this has been an interesting year, but it has also been encouraging and exciting to see God moving!

Last spring-summer we went through what was the second half of our focus on fundamental truths about Christianity, other religions, world views and why you would "Bet Your Life" (our theme for the year) on Christianity above all else. It was a rewarding study as we introduced/reinforced these concepts, learned about each other and challenged each other along the way.

This summer we were able to head out on our summer retreat to Harpers Ferry, WV. We stayed in treehouse bunks, had campfire discussions, went tubing on the Potomac River, hiked to a waterfall and genuinely had a blast together, growing closer as a group and in our understanding of God's will.

This fall, we moved into our current focus of "Parables". We have been discussing the parables in their context and working to understand what it was that Jesus was communicating to the different groups who were present and listening at the time. This has led to wonderful times of discussion as we delve deeper into the text. It is encouraging to see God working in the lives of our young people as they engage in scripture and deeply consider what Jesus is teaching through the parables and how we can apply it to our lives today, in order to grow closer to Him.

We also had a fall lock-in this year which was a ton of fun and a great chance for the group to We have seen over 40 different youth attend Living Stones at one point this past year, while averaging around 16-20 students per week over the course of this past year.

As we begin 2022, we will continue our parable study through the spring. We are also looking forward to a day trip to the Bible Museum as well as spring & summer retreats!

Wonders of Worship

Wonders of Worship (W.O.W.) has been a blessing to all involved this year! We are using the New City Catechism curriculum which is adapted from the Calvin's Geneva Catechism, the Westminster Shorter and Larger catechisms, and the Heidelberg Catechism. This curriculum takes complex biblical and doctrinal concepts and teaches them at an accessible level for the children in WOW (4 year olds-2nd grade). This 52 week curriculum includes three parts:

Part 1: God, creation and fall, law

Part 2: Christ, redemption, grace

Part 3: Spirit, restoration, growing in grace

Each week we are blessed to have about 8-10 children in WOW.

Nursery

Our Nursery continues to serve families with young children during our services and we want to thank all those who have volunteered over this past year to make this possible.

Christian Service Brigade

Battalion

Again, this year, Battalion has been unable to find a lead officer (Captain). Therefore, we still do not have an active unit at Liberty. Instead two Liberty boys and one adult participate with the Chapelgate unit. At meetings this year the boys and adults have been learning about Knot Tying, Car Care and Flag etiquette. They have participated in the Battalion 252 Challenge that involved physical, mental and social exercises tied to their study courses. Our prayer request is that God will raise up a captain, leaders and more boys to participate, so that we can continue to operate at Liberty.

Stockade

The spring portion of the 2021 Stockade program was halted due to the pandemic. However, we regrouped in the summer of 2021 beginning with an invitation from the Interim Head of School, of LCS, Marcia Antoine to take part in a Q & A session with parents of LCS students. Liberty's Children's Ministries coordinator, Sarah Crowe was gracious enough to present the Stockade program to LCS at their back school night. I ask that you pray for students to be receptive to our call to participate in the Stockade program. In the fall of 2021 Stockaders completed a unit on holiness and our reliance on the Holy Spirit. Stockaders were taught woodworking skills in conjunction with biblical lessons on holiness and built a shelving unit upon learning those skills. Our hope for the Spring of 2022 is to further our outreach to LCS and partner with students to participate in our annual StocKar derby, and beyond.

Pioneer Girls

We are planning to reopen Pioneer Girls in 2022.

OPEN HEARTS

Open Hearts Ministry- Serving Foster Families and Vulnerable Children

The Open Hearts ministry continued to grow the areas of services in 2021, again with increased need for tangible items from the Blessings Closet.

In January

We received an enormous number of new toys from a Baltimore Aldi store. We were able to keep some to give out through the Blessings Closet and also shared some donations with Church at Baltimore.

In April

Through the many donations for the Blessings Closet, we compiled 10 "First Night bags" to donate to Baltimore County Department of Social Services. These bags are filled with diapers, wipes, formula, clothing, a stuffed animal, book, and more to comfort a baby or child entering the foster system and to support foster families as they often do not receive advanced notice of a child coming to their home.

Throughout the Year

We served a total of 19 individual foster families through Baltimore and Carroll Counties, Kennedy Krieger treatment foster care and Building Families for Children treatment foster care. We also served 20 vulnerable families through the Blessings Closet donations.

In both April and October this year

We spoke about the Open Hearts ministry at the Carroll County Foster Parent Panel night. These nights are the last training that new foster parents go through as a part of their licensing process. We were excited to share about the upcoming foster mom support group that Liberty will be hosting monthly beginning in January 2022.

In the Fall

A Liberty congregation member went to the home of a single foster-adoptive mama of 2 children to do some household repairs that she was unable to do alone given her medical status. She was blessed to receive the assistance from Open Hearts ministry.

Praise God

- We were able to serve at The Children's Home since May 2018. When the campus was shut down during COVID-19, visitors were not allowed on campus. The Bible Study leaders began meeting with the girls weekly via Zoom calls. It was more challenging to engage with the girls as we have not met most of them in person and with them crowding around one computer for the call. But God is faithful! Our leaders were invited back on campus for Bible Study, beginning at

the end of October this year. We share topically about God, Jesus, sin, forgiveness, grace, and share our testimonies. In December, the girls were blessed with Christmas gift bags of necessities and treats, while learning about the greatest gift of all, Jesus.

- We were able to give donations of formula, diapers, wipes, baby equipment and clothing to Alpha Pregnancy Center multiple times throughout the year. We received some referrals through Alpha when the family is in a vulnerable position and has older children in the home.
- Many donations were given to five Safe Families “host families”, an organization under Building Families for Children, which helps support vulnerable families, at risk of their children entering the foster care system. We also supported their treatment foster care system, with donations.
- Donations of adult clothing and shoes were sent to the Westminster Rescue Mission.

In December

Members of the congregation donated to the Blessings Closet wish list. Donations of diapers, wipes, formula, pacifiers, bottles, new undergarments, socks and more were collected so we can continue to provide for families in need, serving the fatherless.

MISSIONS REPORT - SHARING THE GOSPEL

Liberty Church currently supports 31 individual missionaries/ministries:
13 foreign, 18 local/domestic

Included in these ministries we support: 4 universities/college ministries; 2 Christian schools (LCS and Mt. Clare) and 2 county-wide high school ministries (Young Life).

Because of Covid we only recently began having Missions' Sundays: (August and November) There were funds available for One-time additional gifts and honorariums totaling \$17,600.00. This abundance was due to gifts received from the congregation designated for Missions and, some missionaries, that we had supported for years, retired from the field.

The Missions' house, despite the pandemic, was available and used by two families.

The Missions Committee and the missionaries that Liberty Church supports continues to covet prayers for wisdom and guidance as we all seek to be good stewards of God's abundant blessings.

LIBERTY CHRISTIAN SCHOOL

We are blessed to be involved in a ministry that impacts the lives of many children in our area and supports Christian parents in raising their children by providing a quality Christ-centered education. Our primary goal for this past year was to develop a plan to keep the school open, healthy and safe while still providing a quality Christ-centered education.

We started the 2020/21 school year with 138 students and in January we had 142 students. Our plan for the year gave parents options on how their children would attend school. We offered three plans; fully virtual, attend in person two days a week with two days virtual, attend in person four days a week. The fifth day would be a day for conferences with teachers and also to work at home.

With students back in the building we maintained health protocols to keep everyone safe. We checked temperatures every morning, everyone in the school wore masks, we installed new drinking fountains, purchased HEPA filters, implemented social distancing and COVID testing for all after Christmas and Easter breaks. While we did experience some COVID cases, we had procedures for limiting the impact which kept the school open.

Our teachers and staff faced many challenges throughout the school year due to added responsibilities. They ensured that all health protocols were followed. They learned to teach virtually while simultaneously teaching students in the classroom. They learned how to use new equipment in order to teach virtually and communicate with parents. All of these new responsibilities were on top of their lesson plans, parent conferences, homework assignments and other duties in the school. All of this added a great deal of stress to the teachers and staff. The school community was constantly in prayer for the teachers and staff and God saw them through the 2020/21 school year.

The 2021/22 school year started with the school back to in person learning five days a week. We still have a few students learning virtually who did not feel comfortable being back in the school building. This year's enrollment is 152 students and is still growing. With students being back in the building we were able to hire specialty teachers, offer before care and after care, and open the cafeteria. This brought the school closer to being back to pre-COVID operations. We still have COVID protocols in place. Student safety is a top priority; we take temperatures every day, everyone wears masks, maintain CDC recommended social distances and tested the school population for COVID upon returning to school after Thanksgiving. We will do the same testing after Christmas vacation. We have had a few cases of COVID but nothing that caused the school to close.

God continues to bless our school. The school is financially sound due to careful budgeting, previous surpluses, and COVID relief funds. We have dedicated teachers and staff, and our enrollment is growing. We have added new positions that will enhance our quality of education and help us to continue to grow. We are teaching Biblical truth in a post-truth world. The world is constantly trying to mold our children into its image. Paul warns us about being molded and shaped by the world in Romans 12:2, "And do not be conformed to this world, but be transformed by the renewing of your mind, so that you may prove what the will of God is, that which is good and acceptable and perfect." Please pray that we can give our children a solid Biblical foundation to help them to not be molded by the world, but by their faith in a Holy loving God.
